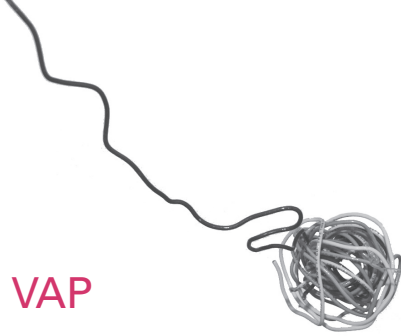

This event is presented in conjunction with courses 4.381/4.366 *Give Me Shelter: Conditions of Living in Unstable Times*, taught by Professor Ute Meta Bauer and 4.370/4.371 *Give Me Shelter: Body Wear*, taught by Visiting Associate Prof. Regina Moeller.

Yoon will discuss the relationship between form/performance, interactivity/media, and inhabitation/event in her work. She sees her work in 'clothing' not as a fashion designer, but as an architect, creating wearable architectures that help construct new relationships for the body in space. She will explain how her conceptual clothing projects enable her to test ideas that are later incorporate into larger-scale installation and architectural projects.

Yoon is an Associate Professor at MIT in the Department of Architecture and founder of MY Studio in 2000 and Howeler + Yoon Architecture in 2005. Her multidisciplinary practice includes architecture, installations, concept clothing and artist books. Recipient of the Architectural Record's Design Vanguard, the Architectural Leagues Emerging Voices, and the Rome Prize in Design, her work has been exhibited at the Museum of Modern Art in New York, the Los Angeles Museum of Contemporary Art, the Institute of Contemporary Art in Boston, the National Art Center in Tokyo, and the Museum of Contemporary Art in Chicago.
