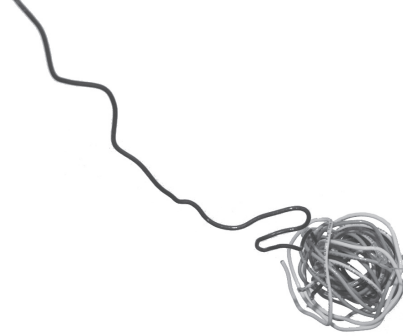

Electra is a contemporary art agency which commissions and produces contemporary art projects across disciplines. Electra aims to engineer a space for cultural production independent to existing institutional networks, through interventions which often take their cue from the self organisation seen in improvised music-making and DIY communities. Dzuverovic will introduce the work of Electra and present 'Her Noise' - a recent initiative which explored music and sound histories in relation to gender. She will also discuss Electra's latest project '27 Senses', which takes the life and work of Merz artist Kurt Schwitters, who was as well a member of the DADA movement, as a starting point for the creation of a temporary zone for production and collaboration.

Lina Dzuverovic is the co-founder and Director of Electra, a London based contemporary art agency established in 2003. She was named the 2006 deciBel Mid-Career Curatorial Fellow by Arts Council England. Formerly Lina Dzuverovic was New Media Curator at London's ICA; prior to this she worked for The Wire Magazine, Mute Magazine, The Lux Centre for Film, Video and Digital Art and the Pandaemonium Festival Of The Moving Image.

Directions

The Visual Arts Program at MIT is located above the MIT Museum. Enter through the grey door on Front Street and take the elevator to the third floor. Exit to your left and go down the ramp. The Joan Jonas Performance Hall is located on the right.
